Go With H2O

What is the substance that contains no calories, makes up 60 percent of our body weight and is practically free? The answer is WATER. Two thirds of our bodies are composed of water making it the body's most vital nutrient. Why is water so valuable?

- Helps your body digest food and absorb nutrients
- Keeps your body working properly
- · Carries away bodily waste
- Cools the body through perspiration

"But I don't like the taste," you may hear? Become the master of disguise and mix lemon or lime slices in the water. Try making water a drink option at mealtime or snacks. Offer children water when they want a snack just before a scheduled meal.

Cucumber Citrus Water

Ingredients:

- 1 cucumber, sliced
- 1 orange, sliced
- 1 lime, sliced
- 1 cup ice
- Water

Instructions:

- 1. Add cucumber, orange, and lime to a 2-quart drinking pitcher.
- 2. Top with the ice and water.
- 3. Can be served immediately. However, for more flavor, chill for 30 minutes or more. (experiment with other ingredients such as: strawberries, raspberries, basil, mint)

Job Tools for Success

Since going over resume basics in February's newsletter, our focus this month is on Cover Letters to help get the interview and Thank You Letters after you have received an interview.

The Basic Elements of a Cover Letter

- 1. **Greeting:** Address your cover letter to the proper person.
- 2. **Opening Paragraph:** Write a personable, inviting opening paragraph that highlights the position for which you are applying, how you learned of the position, and how your skills are a perfect fit for the job.
- 3. **Second Paragraph Hook:** Highlight 1 or 2 past achievements as they relate to the job you're apply-
- 4. Second or Third Paragraph Skills: Highlight additional relevant skills, such as computer, languages or certifications.
- 5. Closing: Briefly recap your strengths as a candidate, thank the person for considering your resume, and include your contact information.

Elements of a Thank You Letter

- 1. Time Frame: Plan to send out your thank letter(s) as soon as possible after your interview. Preferably within 24 hours.
- 2. Who to Say Thank You for an Interview: Send a thank you letter to the person interviewing you. If there was more than one interviewer, you will need to judge the personality of the organization and decide if a group letter will suffice or if a personalized letter to each interviewer is more appropriate.
- 3. Make an Impression: Use your letter as a way to stand out from the crowd and make a good impression. If there was something that you wished you had mentioned during the interview, use this chance to say it. Reiterate your interest in the job, your qualifications, and your skills.
- 4. Wrap Up: Keep your letters short and simple. Spell check and proofread your thank you letters.

- 1 Package Green Candy Melts (You can also find these at Walmart in the craft section)
- •1 Package Vanilla Sugar Wafers
- Assorted Sprinkles

DIRECTIONS:

Melt about half of the package of candy melts according to package instructions. Lay out a sheet of parchment paper and dip each wafer into the chocolate. Place the dipped wafers on the parchment paper and immediately decorate with sprinkles. Allow to dry for a few minutes. Once dry, immediately place in an air tight container so that the wafers don't get stale. Enjoy!
