Agency Highlights

Delivering High-Quality, Accessible, and Well-Managed Services

Describe the first of three management accomplishments achieved by your agency during the reporting year. Be sure to explain how responsible, informed leadership and effective efficient processes related to this accomplishment led to high-quality, accessible, and well-managed services.

During the 2019 Program Year, the Education Management Team worked closely with our Preschool Education Teachers and Assistant Teachers to increase their implementation of the Creative Curriculum and its Daily Resources. Classrooms that utilize our chosen research-based Creative Curriculum consistently collect increased child outcomes data, realize increased child progress over the course of each program year, witness more engaged, enthusiastic learning among the children, and identify less challenges with regard to behaviors in the classroom. Classrooms were assessed early each program year to determine the level by which the curriculum is implemented with fidelity. Teachers were provided support related to each area of curriculum implementation indicating need for improvement. Professional Development Plans were developed for all teachers, with goals established. Teachers were asked to complete training specifically related to curriculum implementation and one on one and electronic support with resources and recommendations were provided regularly. Our data indicates an increase in Curriculum Fidelity implementation of 15% during this 2019 period over the last 2018 program period, with all classrooms implementing our Curriculum with moderate to strong fidelity this year!

In an effort to even more clearly assess the impact of this work, we are now reporting our School Readiness successes by measuring the % of children meeting or exceeding widely held expectations across all learning areas, rather than simply reporting program wide growth by learning area between each reporting period. The goal is that program wide, 75% of all children meet this goal, so now teachers strive toward meeting our 75% target within their classrooms, paying close attention to individualized support needed by child, curriculum enhancements needed by learning area, and encourages teachers to talk with families about how to partner to support children's learning in the home.

This same approach will now be taken with our Infant and Toddler classrooms / data during this upcoming program year. (2500 Characters)

Describe the second of three management accomplishments achieved by your agency during the reporting year. Be sure to explain how responsible, informed leadership and effective efficient processes related to this accomplishment led to high-quality, accessible, and well-managed services.

In response to data collected and analyzed over the past 3 years, United Community Services of Lawrence County, Inc.'s management staff expanded access to preschool child care services during 2019. In direct relationship to providing Early Head Start services through contractual partnership with Lawrence County Social Services, Inc., the number of preschool aged children (once too old for EHS eligibility) needing a high quality preschool or child care program has grown, in particular, at the Ellwood City Early Learning Center site (ECELC). The Ellwood City and immediately surrounding area's demand for preschool aged early learning services typically far outweighs existing facilities' capacity. By converting existing empty space at ECELC to be compliant with child care certification requirements, the child care capacity of that facility doubled from 45 to 90.

Families of preschoolers who needed child care quickly applied for and filled a classroom of 20 children during the summer. With one additional, and yet empty certified child care space remaining, UCS can meet additional demand quickly, should it continue to grow. (2500 Characters)

Describe the third of three management accomplishments achieved by your agency during the reporting year. Be sure to explain how responsible, informed leadership and effective efficient processes related to this accomplishment led to high-quality, accessible, and well-managed services.

Prior to July 2019, the LCCAP Transportation Department operated from two different facilities. Vehicle operators, the fleet of vehicles, and the maintenance garage were located at the Fleet Center, which is located at 701 N Mercer Street, New Castle. The office and management personnel responsible for administering the programs and handle all customer-facing responsibilities were located at the agency's Administrative Offices, located at 241 W Grant Street, New Castle. Although these facilities are less than a mile from each other, the separation translated into a breakdown in daily communication and ongoing challenges in improving the provision of transportation services. During Spring 2019, upper management saw the opportunity to improve the quality and consistency of the agency's transportation programs by moving all transportation staff to the same facility. In July 2019, the office and management

personnel were relocated to the office space that adjoins the Fleet Center. The facility was re-named the LCCAP Transportation Facility and encompasses all agency personnel who are responsible for all levels of operating the agency's transportation services. The result has been overwhelmingly positive, and the impact has been improved customer service, increased communication between all personnel, and an improved transportation services available to Lawrence County Residents. Please describe how your agency addressed a specific cause or condition of poverty in the community using an innovative or creative approach. Showcase how your agency relied on mobilization and coordination of resources to help reach interim and final outcomes. In 2018, LCSS was awarded a discretionary grant - STEAM Coalition - as a planning grant to create a STEAM learning lab for preschoolers and their families. More funding, resources, and leveraging was needed to fully implement this project. In October 2019 LCSS was awarded a USDA Urban Ag grant which we call LCCAP Healthy Start. This funding will integrate indoor and outdoor growing with STEAM activities through urban agriculture infrastructure we will call the "Ag Lab", which will be an education and resource center for preschoolers and their families, as well as the local community. This project will fully come to fruition in 2020 and would not be implemented without the seed money from CSBG discretionary funds. (2500 Characters)

Detailed description of activity, including capacity, duration, targeted population, etc.?

By integrating indoor growing, outdoor growing and education we propose a plan that will benefit the urban agriculture infrastructure in our area by giving the public and those interested in urban farming a laboratory or as we call it an "Ag Lab" to learn various urban farming and gardening techniques which they can then use to improve their homes, neighborhoods, and communities. The "Ag Lab" and education center will give urban farmers the resources to distribute and market their produce. Federal food voucher programs and SNAP can help urban farmers tremendously by giving them more opportunities to generate income which leads to more sustainable gardens. This space will be dually used for preschool STEAM activities by incorporating agricultural activities into the curriculum for both the children and their families.

Analytic Approaches for Long-Term Solutions

Provide an example of changes made by the agency to improve service delivery and enhance impacts for low-income individuals, families, and communities based on the agency's in-depth analysis of its performance data.

LCSS staff were named the chair of the Western CoC Veterans Subcommittee. The Veterans Subcommittee's main task was to improve our service delivery system so that we could submit a claim to the USICH that we had effectively ended Veteran homelessness in our 20 County region.

LCSS engaged the 5 VA Medical Centers, 4 Supportive Services for Veteran Families providers, Grant and Per Diem providers, emergency shelters, and other stakeholders to review our performance as a COC and begin to refine processes and coordination among stakeholders. This effort required the COC to be able to have a mechanism to identify all Veterans experience homelessness, engage them in services, and place them into permanent housing as quickly as possible.

On December 21, 2018, our CoC Submitted its claim to USICH, and the claim was affirmed or approved on September 12, 2019. By making this declaration, our community can now say the following:

o Whenever a Veteran experiences homelessness, we identify them quickly and house the Veteran in less than 90 days on average. o We have identified Veterans experiencing chronic and long-term homelessness and have worked to house these Veterans.

o There are enough housing and service resources available in our community to assist any Veteran experiencing homelessness.

o We are providing long-term housing resources to Veterans and not relying on short-term housing interventions except when the Veteran needs specialized services.

How did the agency identify the need to improve service delivery?

We were provided technical assistance by TAC, Inc. which allowed us to review our local and COC systems and processes in comparison to USICH's Criteria and Benchmarks for ending Veteran homelessness. We conducted 3 separate formal reviews (every 3-4 months) which engaged our COC leadership and providers. These formal reviews gauged our progress toward achieving the Criteria and Benchmarks and revealed gaps that we needed to address.

LCSS worked with PA DCED to embed the data points required for review into PAHMIS. This allowed for real time data. Each review left us with areas for improvement which had to be addressed in order to continue to move toward meeting the benchmarks. Our committee also held a weekly case conferencing call to review all Veterans on the list and work toward moving them into permanent housing as quickly as possible. This allowed us to see each week the number of Veterans that needed served, where they were, and how quickly they were being assisted.

How did the agency use performance data to conduct the in-depth analysis?

After each review, the committee, led by LCSS would identify gaps which required the engagement of additional stakeholders, the creation of new policies and procedures, and more coordination. Each review allowed us to see which benchmarks we were meeting, and which benchmarks we still had work to do. PA DCED also built a report within HMIS so that we could pull our data and compare it to the benchmarks at any point in time. By tracking our outcomes through these reports, we could gauge our progress (or lack thereof).

What local partners were involved, and how did they contribute to the agency's analysis?

While the entire CoC was indirectly involved (as we pulled their data from HMIS), key partners included the 5 VAMCs (Butler, Altoona, Pittsburgh, Erie, and Bath, NY), the VISN 4 Office, the 4 SSVF Providers (Lawrence County Social Services, Soldier On, Veterans Leadership Program and Veterans Multi-Service Center), PA DCED HMIS team, Douglas Tetrault of TAC, Inc., and Mechling Shakely Veterans Center (GPD program).

We utilized USICH's Criteria and Benchmarks for Ending Veteran Homelessness. These indicators included:

1> The total number of Veterans identified as homeless in a 90 day look back period

2> The total number of Veterans placed into permanent housing during the same time frame

(The number of Veterans identified had to be less than the number of Veterans entering permanent housing in order to meet this benchmark)

3> The total number of Veterans placed into transitional housing during the same time frame

5> The number of days from point of identification to housing move in date

Problem Identification	Community Level Need: School Districts and preschool providers must ramp up STEAM curriculum and activities since STEAM literacy has a profound and growing impact on the complexities of our day-to- day lives and is critical to be successful in the 21st Century workforce. There is some implementation of STEAM activities in some of the school districts, but not all. This is especially evident with preschoolers, and yet the Head Start-endorsed Creative Curriculum Teaching Strategies align seamlessly with the STEAM model of educational instruction. STEAM Coalition will assist Teachers with developing the knowledge and skills through training to implement more STEAM activities in classrooms and other settings, as well as seek funding to build capacity.

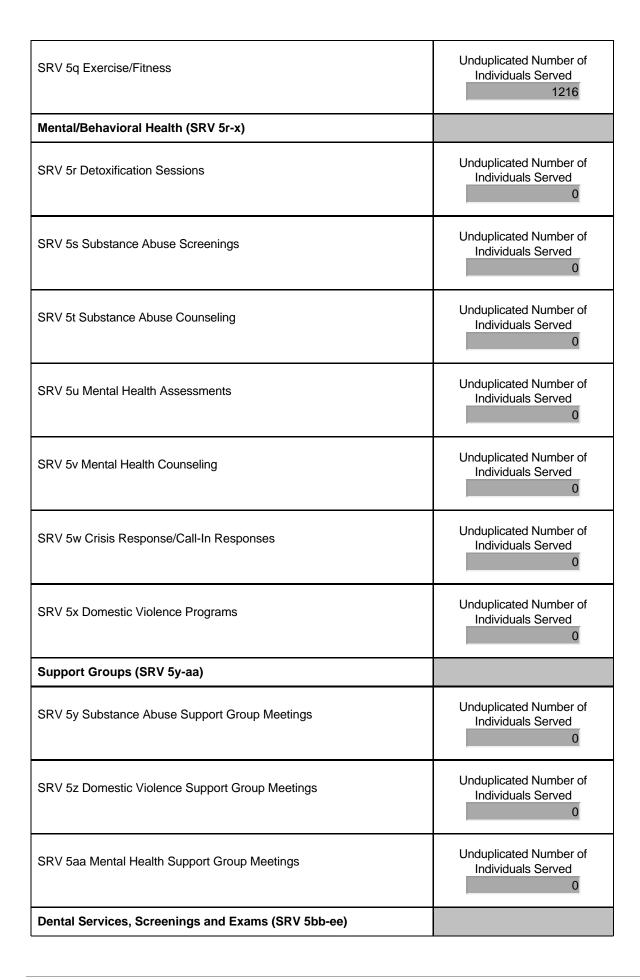
